



# Common Exception Word Activities

Children will be expected to read and spell a number of words known as common exception words correctly in their English work by the end of the year. Below are some fun and exciting ways to learn these Common Exception Words for children in Early Years and Key Stage One.

## Bath Bubbles

Using the bubbles in the bath write the letter for the words on the bathroom tiles.



## Paintbrush Marking

Use a paintbrush and water to write a word on the patio. Can your child read them? Encourage your child to have a go at writing it using the paintbrush and water.

## High Five

Draw around your hand and cut the handprint out. Place the word on the handprint and pop these on the doors in your home. As you enter or leave a room, high five the handprint and read the word.



## Chalk Fun

Write the words you are learning in chalk on the brick wall or patio in the garden.

## Rainbow Writing

Write the word in red, then overlay in orange, yellow and so on.



## Fridge Magnet Letters

Build the word using the fridge alphabet letters. Can you challenge yourself and read all of the words?

## Sharpie Lego

Write the alphabet on some Lego bricks using a sharpie. Encourage your child to build the words.



## Word Search

Search for the word in old magazines and newspapers. Cut it out and stick it on the paper.
