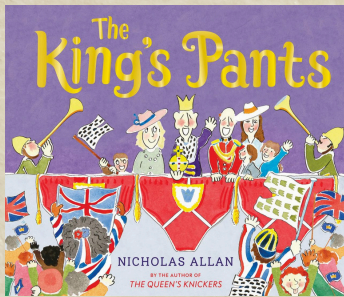


Year 1 Book Warmer
